Dress Code



The Scout uniform is a very important part of the BSA program. All Scouts are encouraged to bring their BSA Field Uniform (Class A shirt) to camp. Each Scout and leader are encouraged to wear a complete BSA Field Uniform for Flag Retreat Ceremonies, Dinner, Vespers and Campfires. Otherwise, the Activity Uniform (Class B) is recommended. When wearing a Class, A shirt, it should always be tucked in.

Swimwear must be "Scout -appropriate." I.e. board shorts/swim trunks for males and one-piece suit s for females. No bikinis, "Speedos," etc. will be allowed. T-shirts or rash guards may be worn in the water.

Undergarments should be covered at all time. Women's shirts should have a modest neckline. Tank tops should have shoulder straps of 1" or wider. All shirts should have shoulder straps or sleeves.

Every Scout must wear shirt and shoes in the Dining Hall. Hats must be rem oved upon entering for meals. Wet items, such as swimming trunks, are not appropriate to wear during meals as all Scouts and adult leaders should be in dry clothes except while participating in aquatic activities.

Shirts or other clothing with explicit material, profane language, political statements or age- inappropriate activities (alcohol, tobacco etc....) are not permitted at Camp.

Open toed shoes are not permitted in camp. Water shoes or old sneakers must always be work in the water.
